1 Introduction:

The University's aim to provide access to quality education to the masses irrespective of the caste, creed, religion and gender is aligned with the Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) 4 of the United Nations. In a country like India, with diversity in culture, tradition, religious beliefs, reaching out to one and all for quality education at affordable cost is a near indomitable feat. The University works in close association with its sister organization, Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences, its internal societies and the Government in this direction to make this feat a reality.

- To empower 2 million indigenous children through quality education.


3 Initiatives:

The University is continually involved in different educational outreach activities beyond the campus through its faculty members, staff and also its students. They provide voluntary and free educational programs to School students in remote and rural areas belonging to different standards. Simple scientific experiments and demonstrations are carried out to inspire the students belonging to poor communities to continue their education with a goal to excel in life. The University has adopted several schools where it provides financial support, development of academic infrastructure, libraries, basic education and awareness on the SDGs, proper sanitation and access to sports and recreation facilities to the students of the area. Faculty members are engaged in providing training to the teachers on content delivery, public speaking and students/parent counseling to reduce dropout rates. Voluntary teaching classes with students with special learning activities are carried out in different schools once or twice a month by both the faculty members and senior students of the University. Awareness camps on education, health and hygiene are carried out every month in selected areas. Special vocational and skill development programs are also carried out with high school students belonging to poor communities to ensure that they have a stable livelihood. A community engagement cell has been set up in this regard. All these programs are carried out both on adhoc and programmed basis. Besides, the staff and students enormously contribute to the educational ventures of its sister concern, Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS) which started in Bhubaneswar and is now on its way to setting up satellite centers to reach out more to the downtrodden segments of the society with the mission to eradicate poverty by providing quality education to all.

Academic Research

Academic research focuses on current research topics using formal, scientific and systematic procedures to discover answers.

Research on academic topics around SDGs are also being given importance in the University. Research on Quality education leading to quality papers is being carried out. The list of papers on quality education published in 2019 and 2020 are given in Appendix I.

Placement opportunity for University Students: The University has been getting cent percent placement since inception. More than 6000 students get placed each year. With more than 500 students getting multiple offers. The highest package for the year 2020 was 36.00 lakhs while the average was 6.50 lakhs


- Placement opportunity for tribal Students 5000 alumni of KISS are already placed in different government, non government, banking as well as corporate sectors with an average salary package of 4.00 lakhs. KIIT has helped the first generation learners to come out from their unrecognised lives inside the jungle to the social mainstream and helped them to lead a decent life.
- Placement opportunity for Unemployed Youth: The University conducts skill development programmes for school dropouts and unemployed youth to motivate them to learn different job-specific skills as per their interest and pursue their career in that line. Not only the students are skilled as per the field of their choice, counselors are also available to counsel the students to take up the job available in different sectors to earn their livelihood. In 2019-20 KIIT has trained 35000+ youth of Odisha through various skill development programmes and placed them in the large companies, NGO and financial sector.

Highlights to all these activities are given in the following sections:

3.1 Access to Library for General Public

The University has made many provisions for providing access to educational resources for outsiders, those not studying at the University.

Several provisions made by the University in this regard are given below:



Vast arrays of educational resources are provided through the various libraries spread across different campuses of the

University. The central library provides educational reading material to public. The reading materials span a wide spectrum of subjects thus enabling anybody to gather knowledge in almost any domain of their choice.

Apart from this, public can also have access to the Digital library and its resources through terminals available at the central library (http://library.kiit.ac.in/index.html).Digital Library is open to the public round the clock.

Three public libraries namely Kamyaa, Kavyaa and Karamchand have been started in the campus on 2nd October 2019 to commemorate the 150th Birthday of Mahatma Gandhi. Kamyaa has a collection of fictional books, Kavvaa has poetic books and Karamchand is dedicated to books on the life and works of Mahatma Gandhi. The University believes that the ideologies of Mahatma Gandhi, the Father of our Nation may be spread through the literary works available here and instill in the youth, a vision to contribute to the society and development of the nation. Scholars doing doctoral and research work on the Indian society and influence of the Mahatma Gandhi on our nation, will find a plethora of information in these libraries to facilitate their work.

Spiritual library at Jagannath temple in the campus has been established to provide a balanced collection of works acquired from distinguished religious institutions, missions, and Maths. It caters to the spiritual needs of the people, humble souls, saints and philanthropists.

3.4 Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences (KISS)

Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences – KISS, Bhubaneswar, India is a fully free, fully residential home for 30000 poor indigenous/tribal children who are provided holistic education from kindergarten to post graduation along with lodging, boarding, health care facilities besides vocational and life skills Details be found URL link: empowerment. can at https://kiss.ac.in/about/. The University plans to educate 2,00,000 indigenous (tribal) children over the next decade and in the process of setting up branches in 10 states, with the support of respective state governments, and in all 30 districts of Odisha. The students are high achievers in academics, co-curricular activities, national and international sports, making it a highly successful model of tribal empowerment through education in the World. KISS has also set up centers in Delhi, Mayurbhani, Balasore which are currently functioning.

KISS Delhi https://www.kissdelhi.ac.in/ is a joint venture of Govt. of National Capital Territory (NCT) of Delhi and KISS Bhubaneswar to provide quality education and vocational training to the orphans and children belonging to the economically weaker section of the society. It is a fully free residential school with 1200 students imparting education from Class I to Class XII under Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) curriculum. The School is fully supported by the Govt. of Delhi and managed by

the Chief Executive Officer, KISS Delhi and his team very successfully.

Recognizing the success of KISS model in Bhubaneswar. Bangladesh is all set to replicate a congruent version of it in Dhaka and Jessore. Branch at Dhaka is being set up in association with Daffodil International University, Dhaka. Jessore Branch is supported by 'Banchte Shekha', a leading NGO led by Dr. Angela Gomes, Ramon Magsaysay Laureate. KISS shall provide technical and managerial support for the functioning of the two branches.

A new branch of KISS is also being established in Kolkata, West Bengal, in collaboration with 'Help Us Help Them', a Kolkata based NGO that promotes the same cause. It will be a residential school for over 1000 children and will have the same structural model as KISS.

Set up in Baripada in association with Adani Foundation, (https://www.adanifoundation.org/), KISS -Ahmadabad Mayurbhanj provides quality education to the underprivileged children of the tribal dominated areas and neighboring districts.

Emami KISS Residential School is a joint venture with Emami (http://www.emamiltd.in/). Modeled along the lines of Group the original, innovative campus at KISS, it will function as a residential academic centre providing holistic education, accommodation, food, health care, study material and sports training to its students free of cost.

'Oswal- KISS Residential School' has been established in Bolangir, Odisha association with Oswal in Group (http://www.oswalgroup.com/). The School will provide quality education to the underprivileged tribal children of the district and adjoining areas.

Faculty members and students from Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology, regularly visit KISS branches to contribute in academic activities and educational ventures to its students round the year.

3.5 Open-Day Program: Open days have been conducted every second Saturday of the month on pre-appointment basis to propagate the message of 'Education for all' among the school/college students/teachers/ researchers to give them the exposure to the higher education system of the University.

During the visit, the participants have been apprised of the advanced research, cutting edge technology, innovative curriculum and educational experiences. The students of the science stream from Navajvoti Science Higher Secondary School, Bhubaneswar visited the Academic Laboratories and Research Laboratories of the Schools of Engineering, Applied Science and KIIT TBI Centre on 18th January and 25th January, 2020 respectively. Students of class 12th (Science) from Saraswata Residential College, Balakati, Khordha visited the Academic Laboratories and Research Laboratories of the Schools of Engineering and Applied Science on January 11, 2020.



These schools are offering education in vernacular medium. Neither the school nor our University has the option to change the syllabus. Thus, within the academic framework of present syllabus approved by Govt of Odisha, the University is helping the schools in the following domains:

- 1. Content delivery design
- 2. Training the teachers to use the technology to give audio visual experience to students
- 3. Online learning
- 4. Training the teachers in soft skills and teaching methodology
- 5. Give exposure to students and school to different fields of higher education starting from science to engineering, medical sciences, sustainable development goals etc, field visit to other universities, allowing them to attend the various seminars, conferences and events organized by the University.

- 6. Conducting periodical training of the teachers by the HRD department of the University with special focus on academic leadership.
- 7. During COVID 19 pandemic, training programmes on enhanced teaching skills using ICT tools and online video conferencing platforms have been imparted with effective hands on experiences.

3.8 'Educational for All' Summit. The University had organized the Education Summit on the theme "Education for All" in all districts of Odisha and 30 major cities and state capitals of the country to motivate the youth and build up their confidence for joining higher education. More than 50000 participants attended these programmes. Till date, the University has motivated more than 1.5 million people for higher education by organizing national seminars with political, social and technical outlooks. Institute provides recognition to faculty members and students for their contribution towards motivating other students for higher education. Due to COVID pandemic the programme was held online through zoom platform.

KIIT has developed its learning development center to facilitate the preparation of e-learning materials for students from different disciplines across the world. The Center had worked on preparation of specialized courses related to the COVID-19 Pandemic for general public, organized workshops for preparing patent and research project applications for scientific organizations, engaged in collaboration with top ranking Universities for academic exchange and research networking, organized certification programs for teaching and laboratory assistants, organized bridge courses for students from indigenous communities and other countries to facilitate their learning, organized specialized counseling sessions for students with one to one interaction, promoted peer learning and introduced flipped classroom courses,. It is also providing guidance in preparation and application for higher studies, as well as for Civil Service examination in the country. It is organizing certification programs for tribal communities associated with vocational training entrepreneurship and

marketing of forest products, workshops on entrepreneurship strategies, leadership, marketing and entrepreneurship opportunities in the state of Odisha and India. The learning development center has faculty representatives from different departments and Schools as contact persons to whom their faculty-members and students can approach for availing the services and support of the center. 3.9 Adoption of Panchayats and Villages

10 panchayats in Kandhamal and Mayurbhani have been adopted and work has already been started in 2 districts to impart skill development training to the youth to make the area an unemployment free zone.

- The University had conducted various technology-based programs supported by National Science & Technology Entrepreneurship Development Board, Department of Science & Technology, Govt. of India for rural community. The programs have not only brought awareness but have also ensued in promoting a few rural persons for developing technology-based enterprises.
- The University has adopted 10 local villages to develop them as model villages, where students are being taught by the University faculty from time to time. List of villages adopted are: Injina, Satyabhamapur, Gotalgam, Allarpur, Padmakesharipur, Nishchintakoili, Shyamsundarpur, Kalarahanga, Raghunathpur and Pathargadia.
- Survey on 'Developing a sustainable model approach for self reliance of panchayats in Kandhamal district of Odisha- A study based on available natural resources, opportunities for execution and man power' had been conducted in Phulbani, Khajuripada, Daringbadi, Kanjamendi, Tumudiband, Gumagarh, R Nuagan, Kudutuli, Barakhama, Simanbadi

Gram Panchayats. The objective is to impart skills to the youth and potential work force in the selected regions; convert marginal workers to main workers as much as possible and make the Gram Panchayats economically self reliant.

 Research survey on various dimensions of occupational safety and health issues of construction workers in Odisha, issues, challenges and ways to address them had been conducted in 30 districts of Odisha.

3.10 Activities by Students under National Service Scheme

Students and faculty members have been participating in National Service Scheme and National Cadet Corps activities through social awareness campaigns. Street plays on social issues, blood donation camps, cycle rallies and training the underprivileged children etc. have been carried out. https://event.kiit.ac.in/rnc-2020/nss/

3.11 ENACTUS

ENACTUS KISS-KIIT' is an innovative initiative by the students of the University to improve the quality of life in society. Under

this initiative, in 2016, Project SIDDHI was undertaken, which provided opportunity to the oppressed communities specially the transgenders in and around Bhubaneswar to change their lives for the better. They also spread the awareness to eliminate the use of plastic bags by replacing it with handmade paper bags.

After successful collaboration with the transgenders, ENACTUS worked with a voluntary organization, Aaina. The students also worked with the disabled women to make them self-sufficient. The disabled women worked on an order of 5000 newspaper bags from Urban Micro and made crafty bags with designs like gift bags from handmade paper.

ENACTUS in collaboration with Daya Foundation, organization working for women from backward areas prepared an order for "Delight Bakeries" of 14000 brown paper bags with customized print. Another order with the Founder of "Biggies, Burger n more" for an order of 20000 brown paper bags with customized print in collaboration with Niyatee Foundation (https://www.niyateefoundation.org/) and Udvog Foundation (http://udfoundation.org.in/) was undertaken and successfully delivered.

ENWIPE, a project introduced by KISS-KIIT, is a unique concept of water-less car wash service at the customer's doorstep. ENACTUS promoted a special eco-friendly solution for cleaning the vehicles, adding only 500ml of water to 5ml of the solution. The main aim of Project Enwipe is to use minimal amount of water and provide employment opportunities to under privileged and physically challenged (hearing and speech impaired) individuals, simultaneously helping them earn and live as equal contributors in society.

3.12 KanyaKiran 3.0

The third edition of Kanya Kiran' program in association with United Nations Women and Kalinga Fellowship was organised in May 2019. The program covered all the Panchayats of the State of Odisha in India, spreading awareness on social evils of violence against women and girl child among millions of households. Over 3000 staff, particularly women staff were actively involved as coordinators and volunteers. They disseminated the message at household level in villages amid overwhelming response. The Women folk also were made aware of hygiene and environmental issues. Kanya Kiran program was also held on the occasion of National Girl Day 2020.

3.13 Skill Development programs

The University has been providing different skill development trainings under Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY) scheme under Ministry of Rural Development (MoRD) and Pradhan Mantri Kaushal Vikas Yojana (PMKVY) under Ministry of Skill Development & Entrepreneurship (MSDE), Government of India.

3.14 Entrepreneurship Awareness

The University had conducted developmental projects to facilitate women entrepreneurship and stimulate the local women community towards rural entrepreneurship. Mentoring activities including help in formulating proper business model/ plan, product development, fund raising, fund management, developing marketing strategy and other related activities have been provided. Women Empowerment Seminars/ training programmes and Capacity building projects/ programmes for Women Entrepreneurs have also been conducted. Awareness had also been spread among more than 5000 women and they have already benefited.

3.15 TEDxKIITUniversity



Access to all these activities is provided to one and all regardless of ethnicity, religion, disability or gender. As per clause 13.1 of Memorandum of Association (MoA) of the University, 'Admission and employment in the Deemed to be University shall be open to all citizens of India regardless of race, religion, caste or creed and the area/ place of residence in India'.

Besides, clause 13.2 of MoA of the University also states that 'All policies and procedures, in this regard as applicable to KIIT'. The University tries to maintain an impartial gender ratio across its streams. The University has a female representation of about 51% in all courses in the University in 2020. The University had a female representation of about 40% in both academic and non academic positions in the year 2020. The University has appointed a transgender, as its Social Development Officer becoming the first in the private sector India to appoint one.

Students from all social and economic backgrounds of the society have a fair opportunity of pursuing each and every course offered in the University.
