Today, KIIT educates over 40,000 students from 65+ countries, while KISS stands as the world's largest fully residential tribal institution, supporting 80,000 Indigenous children and youth with free education, healthcare, and nutrition.

A former elected Member of Parliament, Prof. Samanta has received 65+ honorary doctorates and over 250 national and international accolades, including the GUSI Peace Prize and top civilian honours from Bahrain and Mongolia. Under his leadership, KIIT and KISS earned UNESCO's International Literacy Prize (2022) and the Rashtriya Khel Protsahan Puruskar by the Hon'ble President of India.



Beyond education, his impact spans rural development, healthcare, women's empowerment, and job creation, supporting over 300,000 livelihoods and mentoring 100 entrepreneurs. Despite global recognition, Prof. Samanta leads a humble life dedicated to eradicating poverty, hunger, and illiteracy.

WHAT WILL THE INDIA TREK LOOK LIKE?

The India Trek is thoughtfully designed to offer a **dual perspective** - from the corridors of power in **New Delhi** to the grassroots innovation hub of **Bhubaneswar**, **Odisha**. Each location brings unique insights, making the experience both intellectually rich and emotionally resonant. If a **third city** is added to the itinerary, it will follow a **similar format to Delhi**, combining local cultural exploration with curated meetings with **influential changemakers** from that region.



Phase 1: Delhi & Agra

The Heart of Power and Policy

As the political and administrative capital of India, Delhi sets the stage for understanding the country's development landscape at the highest levels. Here, delegates will:

- Engage with Cabinet Ministers, unicorn founders, policymakers, lawyers, activists, business leaders, and politicians driving India's growth and reform.
- Gain insight into national policy, innovation ecosystems, and legal frameworks.
- Explore iconic landmarks such as the Rashtrapati Bhavan (President's House), Red Fort, India Gate, Qutub Minar, and Dilli Haat.
- Take a day trip to Agra to witness the magnificent Taj Mahal, one of the Seven Wonders of the World.
- Experience the vibrant cultural fabric of Delhi through its museums, food, art, and architecture, offering a window into India's historical complexity and contemporary contradictions.



Phase 2: Bhubaneswar, Odisha

The Ground of Grassroots Innovation

The second phase brings delegates to KIIT and KISS in Bhubaneswar, the home ground of this unique initiative. Here, delegates **shift** focus from national systems to community-driven change:

- Visit cutting-edge academic and research centres across KIIT University and engage in dialogue with faculty, researchers, and students.
- At KISS, interact closely with Indigenous youth and learn about education, sustainability, and development from the perspective of tribal communities.
- Understand how grassroots innovations and institutional models like KISS are influencing global discourse on equity and inclusion.
- Optional interactions can be arranged with local business leaders, bureaucrats, and policymakers in Odisha's development space.
- Enjoy cultural and historical excursions, including a visit to the Sun Temple in Konark (a UNESCO World Heritage Site) & local markets, crafts villages & temples.

PROGRAMME FUNDING & PARTICIPANT CONTRIBUTION

KIIT & KISS invest, on average, between **USD 2,000–3,000 per student** to support the India Trek experience, depending on the duration of the programme and the size of the group.

The registration fee contributed by participants helps cover aspects of the programme that fall outside the scope of KIIT & KISS' core funding mandate. These include last-minute changes, cancellations, tips, certain costs associated with social events or cultural visits, and other incidental expenses.

WHAT TO SEE





AKSHARDHAM TEMPLE

Registered as the World's largest comprehensive Hindu temple in the Guinness World Record, the temple is an architectural marvel built from intricately carved sandstone and marble.



RED FORT

Constructed in 1639 by the Mughals, Red Fort gets its name from its massive red-coloured sandstone walls. Set in Old Delhi, the Red Fort also features a museum that holds Mughal-era artefacts, including daggers, curtains, miniature paintings and carpets.



INDIA GATE

Designed by Edwin Lutyens, India Gate symbolises the sacrifice of 70,000 Indian soldiers who lost their lives battling against the foreign army during the World War I. it features the undying Flame of the Immortal Soldier, added later to honour martyred soldiers in the Indo-Pak War.



HAUZ KHAS

Hauz Khas, earlier known as Hauze-Alai, is an affluent neighbourhood in South Delhi which holds historical importance with remnants of Mughal architecture. The place is popular for a 13-century structure, Hauz Khas Complex, which retains the old charm amidst the modernised street



CONNAUGHT PLACE

Set in the heart of National Capital and popularly known as CP, Connaught Place is considered as the most expensive commercial markets in the world. It is popular for housing showrooms of national and international brands, luxurious hotels and flea markets.



DILLI HAAT

An outdoor marketplace located near INA Market, Dilli Haat is a permanent bazaar run by the Delhi Tourism and Transportation Development Corporation. It has over 62 stalls presenting handicrafts ranging from antiques to jewellery, clothing, home furnishings, and toys.



QUTUB MINAR

Qutub Minar is a 73-metre tall minaret, named after Outb-ud-din Aibak. Adorned with red sandstone, marble and sandstone and engraved with decorative Quranic texts, the tower has a spiral staircase with 379 steps, and has a mosque named 'Quwwat-ul-Islam Masjid' at the foot of the tower, which is the first mosque in India.



JAMA MASJID

Built in red sandstone and marble & located in the heart of Old Delhi. Jama Masjid is the largest and most well-known mosque in India, constructed between 1650 and 1656 under the reign of Mughal emperor Shah Jahan. Please note that mosque entry is not allowed during prayers.

Beyond the Taj, its majestic Agra Fort, bustling bazaars, and intricate artisan work make it a must-visit destination for any traveler seeking India's imperial legacy.

TAJ MAHAL

The Taj Mahal is a white marble mausoleum located in Agra, India, built by Mughal emperor Shah Jahan in memory of his wife, Mumtaz Mahal. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site, known for its stunning architecture, which blends Persian, Indian, and Islamic styles. The complex includes the mausoleum, a mosque, a guest house, and formal gardens, all situated on the right bank of the Yamuna River

AGRA FORT

Agra Fort is a historical red sandstone fort located in Agra. Uttar Pradesh, India, and is a UNESCO World Heritage site. It was the main residence of the Mughal emperors until 1638. when the capital was shifted to Delhi. Built on the remains of an earlier citadel called Badalgarh, the fort was significantly expanded and fortified by Emperor Akbar, with further additions and modifications by his successors, including Shah Jahan.

MEHTAB BAGH

Mehtab Bagh, meaning "Moonlight Garden," is a historical garden complex located opposite the Taj Mahal in Agra, India. It's a squareshaped, Charbagh-style garden with water bodies, fountains, and walkways. The garden was once envisioned as the site for a black Tai Mahal, but was later restored by the Archaeological Survey of India (ASI). This garden complex is known for its stunning views of the Taj Mahal, especially at sunset or under moonlight.

WHAT TO SEE





JAGANNATH TEMPLE

Odisha is known as the land of Lord Jagannath. The temple, built in the 12th Century AD, sees pilgrims flocking to Puri year-round. Constructed in such a way that no shadow of the temple falls on the ground at any time of the day, the temple is both a religious and architectural marvel.



KONARK **SUN TEMPLE**

This pinnacle of Odisha temple architecture is an UNESCO World heritage Site. Dedicated to the Sun God. this structure leaves one spellbound with its massive structure, symmetry, precision & intricate detailing.



SIMILIPAL NATIONAL PARK

Adorned with beautiful flora & fauna, this national park and tiger reserve in Mayurbhani district of Odisha once used to be a hunting ground for the rules of the province. Now, this is India's largest wildlife sanctuary & an integral part of the country's Tiger Project.



EKAMRA HERITAGE WALK

This guided introductory walking tour of the ancient temples in the old town area ('Ekamra Kshetra') of Bhubaneswar offers an intimate, close-up look at Bhubaneswar's heritage through fascinating stories on temple architecture. history & mythology.



MAHENDRAGIRI HILLS

Located in Gajapati district of Odisha, Mahendragiri peak is the second highest peak of the Eastern Ghats, and Odisha's 2nd biodiversity Heritage Site, boasting dense forests & natural waterfalls, along with points of mythological & archaeological interest.



GAHIRAMATHA BEACH

Located in Kendrapara district of Odisha, this beach separates the Bhitarkanika mangroves from the Bay of Bengal, and is the world's most important nesting beach for Olive Ridley Sea Turtles. It is Odisha's only marine wildlife sanctuary



DARINGBADI. KANDHAMAL

Known as the Kashmir of Odisha, Daringbadi has unparalleled views of lush greenery with dense forests and scenic mountainous viewpoints located amidst the Eastern Ghat Ranges in Kandhamal.



CHANDRAGIRI MONASTERY

Chadragiri Buddhist monastery is one of India's most famous Buddhist temples, inaugurated in 2010 by His Highness the Dalai Lama. Situated in the lap of nature, amidst greenery & a waterfall, this monastery in Gajapati district of Odisha offers a glimpse of Tibetan culture.

CUNY - India Study Abroad students and faculty representing 7 CUNY campuses are being hosted at KIIT University & KISS, Bhubaneswar, Odisha, India. Our students and faculty had the opportunity to tour the two campuses [...] and to see all the initiatives that are taking place particularly with the education of tribal youth. There are over 60 tribes in Odisha alone and India's current President is from the Santhal tribe. Students had an eye opening experience. Two of the students were also interviewed by the local TV station about their experiences. 7 CUNY campuses are represented among the 30 students and the 6 faculty/staff members.

Key highlights:

- Visit to KIIT Academic Departments and Research Facilities: CUNY students engaged in fruitful discussions with faculty and student counterparts about educational experiences and potential academic/research collaborations.
- Beach Clean-up at a Beach: Working with KIIT student volunteers, plastic pollution was removed, addressing the significant issue of methane gas emission and climate change.
- Sun Temple Visit: Students explored the rich architecture and intricate design, reminiscent of cultural sites like the Taj Mahal and Qutub Minar in Delhi.

Exciting opportunities for student internships and faculty research collaborations are emerging at KIIT. [...] Eternally grateful to Dr Achyuta Samanta and VP Dwiti Vikramaditya of KIIT and KISS for the opportunity.

I'm back at Oxford for my final(!!) term, surrounded by beautiful weather (maybe we got lucky, but my controversial opinion is complaints about British food and weather are overblown \circ). As I dive back into campus life, I wanted to reflect on three incredible treks I got to attend over spring break, all organized by Oxford friends who welcomed us to their home countries.

India Trek led by [...] KIIT - Kalinga Institute of Industrial Technology / KISS - Kalinga Institute of Social Sciences. After a few days of business meetings and tourism in / near Delhi, we spent the bulk of this trip in Bhubaneswar, the capital of Odisha. It was really interesting to experience a smaller city in a less well-known part of the country (although small is relative, we were still constantly surrounded by people and cars). We were greeted by 10,000 (incredibly well behaved) students at KISS (https://kiss.ac.in/), a school providing free education for 40,000 poor indigenous students, funded by fees from KIIT (https://kiit.ac.in/), a for-profit university, also with 40,000 students. Both schools were started <30 years ago, it was incredible to see the scale of operations they've built up in such a short amount of time, and the resources provided to the indigenous students (especially in terms of sports facilities).
